The Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) program is designed to teach high school students the value of citizenship, leadership, service to the community, personal responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment, while instilling in them self-esteem, teamwork, and self discipline.

The program quickens advancement for students interested in enlisting in the military after high school graduation. However, regardless of a student's military intentions, the program is open to all and offers the following benefits:
